## Systagenix Wound Management and Wounds UK webinar proves a popular way to access wound care education

This month Wounds UK Television and Systagenix Wound Care provided an online 'webinar' session (a live webcast) which examined the use of antimicrobial dressings in clinical practice.

This has been a new approach to providing wound care education and discussion and proved very popular with almost 400 people watching the live webcast. Hosted by Andrew Kingsley on 4th February 2009, the webinar featured a presentation on wound infection and the role of antimicrobial products in the treatment of wounds with increased bioburden. A series of case studies were presented from the tissue viability department of Aberdeen Royal Infirmary, which highlighted the role of antimicrobial products in the treatment of patients with wounds which were critically colonised or infected.

Jane Clark from Systagenix Wound Care then answered some questions on the clinical positioning of the Systagenix product range. Following the webinar, there was an open forum for discussion, with viewers able to post questions to the available experts. There were more than 60 questions during this session, highlighting the popularity of this new form of education.
