As always, we have tried to meet the demands of the readers and one area which has raised several requests is that of venous leg ulcer management. Both student and newly-qualified nurses have asked for clarification on compression bandages — when to use as opposed to retention bandages, as well as asking about skin reactions to dressings and bandages and the need for basic leg ulcer assessment. It is becoming more and more common for newly-qualified nurses to work in primary care and the need for basic, straightforward information to underpin practice is vital and needs to be incorporated into practice training.

The importance of nutritional assessment and ensuring adequate nutrition for patients has also been included in this volume. Good nutrition is a cornerstone to all tissue viability practice; both in the prevention of pressure ulceration and as an important aid to wound healing. All patients in primary and secondary care require nutritional assessment, especially within the older patient population. In the surgical patient with a dehisced wound, poor nutritional status is often a cause. The two articles, 'Weight loss in the surgical patient' and 'Why do wounds dehisce?' should be read together, as they highlight the issue and consequences of poor nutrition.

This journal is written for you and is distributed free with the genuine aim of providing wound care education for the everyday practitioner who deals with wound-related issues. As always, please continue to give me your feedback, as this will continue to drive the content of the journal.
